FROM OUR QUEENSLAND CORRESPONDENT WHO GIVES US THIS ITEM

You will probably have realized that a chap by the name of Chris Wardlaw will be representing Australia in the Athletics in Montreal at the Olympics in July.

It just so happens he was born in St. Marys. I believe he left there for Victoria at an early age. Chris is a half-brother of Barbara Wardlaw who of course still lives at St. Marys.

Chris, I think, is about 26 or 27 years old, of very slight build, runs with a very strange high knee lifting action, rather like a rooster.

He is a Professor (what in I don't know), and works at the Monash University in Melbourne. is married with a family and lives at Mitcham in Melbourne's Eastern Suburbs.

He used to run with his old schools athletic club - Old Melburnians of Melbourne Grammar School. Since switching to the running club made famous by Ron Clarke, Glenhuntly, he has gone from strength to strength from just another long distance athlete to an Olympian.

When I ran against Chris in Melbourne from 1971 to 1974 - we broke about even but now he's stepped up from the steeples to longer distances such as 10,000 metres (6 mile) to the 26 mile marathon. He is down to run in the 10,000 metres at the Games, Australia's only representative in the event. I think he is entered in the marathon, and will probably run as it is after the 10,000 metres, just for fun and experience.

I doubt whether he will do very well in his race, and if he gets through to the final then he would be doing extremely well. I'm not knocking him but his best times are so much behind those of the world's best, that we just can't expect miracles.

But he is a very well liked popular athlete who is very lucky and has got to the top through determination. His father is Don Wardlaw who lives in Melbourne. Any other details would be available from Barbara Wardlaw.

Chris' selection in the Games, follows close on the footsteps of Kevin Morgan, who spent many years of his life at Mangana, and rode in the Olympic Games cycling road race in Mexico City in 1968.

We understand that our Footballing reporter is playing O.K. After an indifferent start to the season when I was even dropped from the side - I've come back with a vengeance to be playing extremely well as a ruckman in Mayne's B grade side. Both our sides are on top of the ladder. Our A. grade side being undefeated after eleven games.

Both Wayne Walsh (former Richmond) and Dale Frost (North L'ton.) are playing real well.

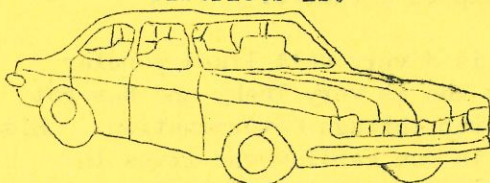

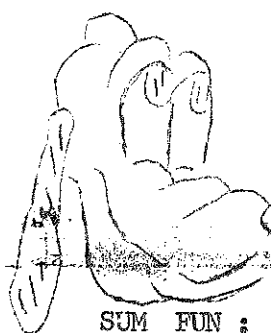

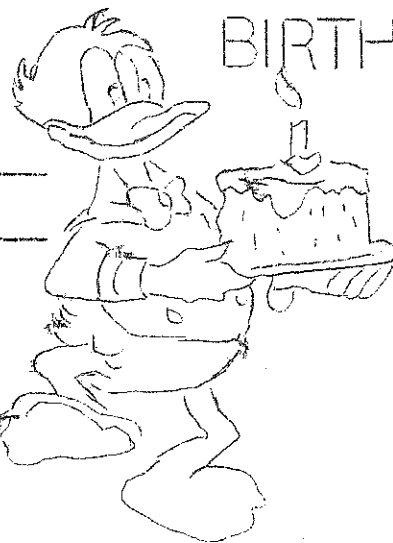
